Total Solar Eclipse on July 22, 2009 at Varanasi, northern India (from Yahoo! Photo)

The solar eclipse that took place on Wednesday, July 22, 2009 was a total eclipse of the Sun with a magnitude of 1.080. The phenomenon was visible from a narrow corridor through northern India, eastern Nepal, Bhutan, central China and the Pacific Ocean. Among the major Chinese cities best for viewing the eclipse were Chengdu, Chongqing, Wuhan, Hangzhou and Shanghai. A partial eclipse was seen from the much broader path of the Moon's penumbra, including most of South East Asia and north-eastern Oceania. This total solar eclipse was the longest of its kind and only occurred once in the 21st century. Totality lasted for up to 6 min and 39 sec, with the maximum eclipse occurring at 02:35:21 UTC about 100 km S of the Bonin Islands, southeast of Japan. Just imagine how awesome it is to view the eclipse by one's own eyes!



Editor's Note 1: My trip to China and India

It is now six years after our secretariat has moved out of USA. The work has spread in several countries, i.e. China, Japan, India, Philippines, Thailand and score of countries that members of our Translators' Club are doing their work – and perhaps a hundred countries that we have Vice Presidents to represent us. These six years could be considered as the great experimental time to prove if the presence of WASWC is really needed? With about ten activities being regularly done, instead of just one that was a norm several years ago, we have proved that the association is needed! We got people from many countries registered as members and they have been participating quite lively. We got nice and kind words from those who benefit from our works frequently.

Anyhow, during those six years the works have been executed from a few spots and the association is therefore NOT sustainable. Everyone knows that time does not stand still – people get older and their capability decreases, though not the willingness. Therefore, during the past two years we had tried to locate institutions that work in our line, have ability and interest to carry out certain parts of the works of WASWC. We are quite pleased to have found a good number of them, mostly locating in South, Southeast and East Asia. So during this last half-year of 2009 I will go to visit a number of institutions, at first in China, starting tomorrow, July 29, where I shall visit Guangzhou, Yangling and Beijing, then go to India in October, to visit Delhi and some cities on the Himalaya foothills. I will work with them so that the processes in doing the WASWC work are to be carried out smoothly.

During these few years we have proved several things. *First*, we mentioned we are a forum where soil and water conservationists worldwide can work together; now we have access to over a hundred countries and more are going to join us (thanks to the availability of the internet, undeniably). *Second*, we said we did not look at the financial aspect to be very important. We now have many (Guest) members who do not pay but we expect that upon the end of their trial period many of them would decide to join as paying members, the rate of which is just minimal when comparing with other societies or associations. This way, we got many more people to get to know us rather than to wait for them to hand us the cash before they could join! *Third*, as an association of people living scattering all over the world, we were previously seen as somewhat incapable in managing certain activities – but now we have been running many activities, including the Journal and Proceedings of WASWC for the fourth year already; we see more people coming in to utilize it.

In short, the World Association of Soil and Water Conservation can do a lot of things to meet the need of people and natural resources. Upon identifying more persons/institutions to take care of various functions we would be able to manage the association as needed and stand to weather the storm of economic crunch like what is happening now – thanks to the many dozens of institutions that are supporting us.

I foresee this half-year period as crucial in stabilizing the works of WASWC, thus making the association sustained for a long time. I therefore wish that the cooperation from the institutions that I am going to visit would all be favorable towards that direction. Upon the end of this half-year period I hope to have made arrangement with all prospective institutions and by the beginning of 2010 WASWC would emerge as a new, strong and stable association that will effectively serve people and natural resources worldwide.

Editor's Note 2: A small amendment to the Guidelines for Successful Meetings

Yesterday I took the Guidelines for Successful Meetings to reread and have made a small amendment of one sentence in point 10. This was done with a belief that the new wording will make it look softer, NOT too demanding. I hope you agree with me that it is worthwhile to make the Powerpoints available, but we should not make it too difficult for those who are NOT YET READY to comply with our suggestion - otherwise our guidelines will only alienate people, making the whole endeavor not so productive. I have adjusted the sentence from:

The organizers should make the Powerpoints from all presentations available, to present in either form, e.g. written on a CD or copied in a 1GB flash drive along with other digital stuff, to all participants at the end of the event. However, any participant may like to withdraw certain slides from his/her Powerpoint if he/she wants to preserve them for future publication – or to withdraw the whole file altogether.

To accelerate sharing of information through technical meetings the organizers are encouraged to make the Powerpoints from all presentations available, to present in either form, e.g. written on a CD or copied in a 1GB flash drive along with other digital stuff, to all participants at the end of the event. However, any participant may like to withdraw certain slides from his/her Powerpoint if he/she wants to preserve them for future publication – or to withdraw the whole file altogether.

I will be happy to hear any feedback from you and hope you will help disseminate the Guidelines to be used wider. At least it will help remind people who like to organize meetings just to satisfy themselves, such as to meet old friends and have some bla-bla-bla sessions, and not sensing that many of their participants, especially those with less opportunity to attend

to

meetings and sometime had to pay a lot of money to travel there, will go home almost empty-handed. Some events in recent past have haunted me too much; they thus stimulated me to work out the way to avoid such thing in the future.

[I want to share something interesting but awful with you. At a meeting in 2008, a (local) lady participant had a presentation to give at a prestigious conference. She asked-cum-invited her mom to come to hear what she would describe from what she had learned from abroad. Her mother came with joy and pride but only to be confronted with three strong guards who did not allow her to enter the building unless she paid the registration fee of almost half a thousand Euros. So the lady participant had to present the lecture with grief and tears and without her mother to witness her achievement. I did not witness this sad event by myself but I was told by a reliable person. I wish that such kind of treatment should not happen in our human society. I wish that all of us who are working to manage and care for the natural resources for the generations to come should be treated with dignity – with an attitude that all of us are living in *only one world*.]

Editor's Note 3: An idea about LANDCON e-LIBRARY

An idea just emerged to me very recently. We have so far got so many works about land, especially about its management, care and rehabilitation in our database. As the WASWC has its mandate in all these subjects, it would be beneficial in gathering such works together from meetings during these few years in the form of a DVD and make it available to members and participants to the meetings particularly those that belong to LANDCON series. Recently, I made a small round of discussion and got a good respond from them. As everyone knows, one DVD may contain a very large amount of works, equal to dozens of text books combined, that you may not be able to read all within one year. To me, if we could make this DVD available as an e-LIBRARY, especially for those in geographical areas that are not well connected with the internet, it could be quite useful in many ways. Some people have been very content with the internet. To me, yes, internet is very good and very efficient in finding things that you know WHAT TO FIND. But if you don't know what to find and there are hundreds of works that belong to your fields contained in a DVD just in front of you and you can get it right away without connecting to the internet, wouldn't that make a good contribution?

I will discuss more about this issue in the next HOT NEWS. In the meantime, I would like to ask our members to please think and make your thinking loud, so that will help us in crystallizing the idea that may lead to either the 'execution' of it or 'scrapping' it.

Online book published on farming with grass in the US

Proceedings of the Farming with Grass Conference held in Oklahoma in 2008 have been published by the Soil and Water Conservation Society in the form of an online manual. Agricultural Research Service scientists and other participants in the conference portrayed a "post-oil agriculture" vision relying on perennials, as well as beef and dairy products from free-ranging, grass-fed cattle.

In summarizing stories from the conference, participants envisioned mixed livestock, perennial plants, and other crops, instead of large stands of a single-row crop monoculture, with a goal is to sustain farms and rural communities both economically and environmentally, while offering local, healthy foods and other new products.

A New Oxfam report warns multiple climate impacts could reverse 50 years of work to end poverty

The report, *Suffering the Science - Climate Change, People and Poverty*, is being published ahead of the G8 Summit in Italy, where climate change and food security are high on the agenda. It combines the latest scientific observations on climate change, and evidence from the communities Oxfam works with in almost 100 countries around the world, to reveal how the burden of climate change is already hitting poor people hard.

The report warns that without immediate action 50 years of development gains in poor countries will be permanently lost. Across the developing world, small-scale agriculture is an important contributor to poverty reduction, rural development, and food security. Small farmers are also a key determinant of environmental outcomes, including land and water management, biodiversity conservation, and climate change, in some of the world's most threatened ecosystems. Yet support for smallholder agriculture has declined sharply in the past three decades, as measured in terms of both national policies and overseas development assistance.

Smallholder Agriculture and the Environment in a Changing Global Context, a new policy brief written by Jonathan Cook of World Wildlife Foundation-US' Macroeconomics Program Office, examines to these issues which explicitly target small farmers, focus on sustainable practices, and involve not just technical interventions (like seeds and inputs) but critical issues of planning, policy, and governance. A Howard Buffett turns to No-Till farming in Africa

After a meeting with farmers in Fufuo, Ghana, Howard Buffett stood up to shake hands, African style. Accompanied by Ghanaian agronomist Kofi Boa, he hurried into a large cinder-block building where 30 farmers had been waiting, sheltered from the sun.

Mr. Boa, the agronomist, had been coaching them to replace slash-and-burn farming with a practice he called "no-till." In many African villages, poor farmers—who are often women—had traditionally made room for their crops by chopping down the brush and trees on a few acres of tribal land. It is hard on the farmer and the environment. The land is laid bare to erosion. As the soil deteriorates, farmers work harder and harder to produce food until they have to move on to another spot, repeating the cycle.

Mr. Boa told Fufuo's farmers to disturb the ground as little as possible. Other than poking holes in the dirt to plant their seeds, the ground was not to be hoed or vegetation burned. Organic residue—such as leaves, stalks, and roots—was valuable, not trash. The village quickly discovered that no-till plots yielded bigger crops with far less labor. The mulch acts as a sponge when it rains, banking water for crops, and then breaks down into plant food. The time the farmers saved by no longer hoeing weeds and cutting brush was time for money-making endeavors. Some started to raise cocoa trees, a crop prized by Ghana's government for its export earnings; others began to raise chickens, feeding them with their surplus grain.
