Editor's Note 1: Flood, flood, flood everywhere ...

MY ROUGH THINKING: At this time about half of the 77 provinces of Thailand are under water. With 20% extra water coming from rainfall (believably due to global warming, as more water evaporates to the sky and falls as rain), this 'extra water' has caused more bad things than good, at least at present. In normal condition if 15-20% of rain has become runoff, that would cause erosion to a certain extent on land of gentle slope to steep slope, as happened up to a few years ago. Now with 20% extra water to add, it means the runoff becomes double or more and the accompanying soil loss is also double or more!!! It means further that the extensionists promoting soil and water conservation in farm land have much more work to do than before – and followed with the budget, which so far is not enough year by year.



I want to tell you a bit of my experience. In Chiang Mai area there used to be flooding once a year. But since 2006 I noted that the flooding in Chiang Mai became something like five times a year. This made me believe about the climate change. But what happened this year is much more alarming: now we have come to the ninth month of the year, I heard from one community in the lower north that they had suffered from flood already eight times this year!!!

What after that? Yes, from flood, you may expect soil erosion, land slide, debris flow, hardship in transportation, hardship in living and earning, poor health – and more crimes, almost anything you think of can be put in the list. And don't forget the degradation of the land as a result and lower productivity as a consequence.

The flood/landslide/debris flow events in Thailand this year have been enormous. This is a wake-up call for the authorities of any country to think of the need to increase budget and work force as well as their officials' competence to cope with such undesired circumstances far into the future. If you know any person who has done outstanding work in soil and water conservation, especially at the international level, please send the name and a short description of the work to us, in order that our Awards Committee can judge the Norman Hudson Memorial Award for this year. Please send your nominations to Prof Li Rui lirui@ms.iswc.ac.cn, WASWAC President, from now until October 15, 2011, to be judged by the Awards Committee. The regulations for judging the Award are as follows:

- * The award may be given to Association members or nonmembers.
- * No officer of the Association shall be eligible for the award while holding office.
- * The service and accomplishments of the nominee shall have made major and widely recognized contributions to soil and water conservation on the international level.

Nomination Procedure

- * Any Association member may make nominations.
- * Nominators should submit nominations in narrative form of up to 1,000 words. The supporting material should document the international scope of the nominee's accomplishments, including such items as professional achievements in natural resource publications and papers written or delivered at professional meetings. Service to the Association either as a member or nonmember and service to other professional or conservation organizations can also be included.

Selection

- * The Association's Awards Committee will review all nominations and select the recipient.
- * The award will be presented at an event designated by the President of the Association.
- * Only one award shall be given each year. No award shall be made if a suitable candidate is not nominated or if the Awards Committee decides the nominees do not fulfill adequately the criteria for the award.



Other demonstrations will include rainfall simulator and power penetrometer assessment of soil condition, together with a soil pit.

Workshops and discussions will include issues of reducing tillage in intensive vegetable production, seeding through heavy crop residues and APSIM (Agricultural Production Simulator) applications. Towards the end of the day there will be a forum on Agriculture and Mining, and a Q&A session with farmers, manufacturers and scientists

Responding to the Challenges of Debris Flow—Asian Network on Debris Flow

Debris flows, a kind of gravity-induced mass movement on hill slopes and/or in river channels are usually the most hazardous phenomena. They occur in response to rapid disturbances, such as torrential storms, sudden snow or glacier melting, dam break, volcano eruptions, landslides or slope failures, and earthquakes. The devastation caused by catastrophic debris flows is enormous, yet their causes, occurrences and mechanisms are not completely understood.

Since the start of the 21st century, as a result of climate change, debris flow hazards occur more and more frequently. These debris flows are caused by typhoon, by rainfall, by glacial lake breaking or by volcano eruption, etc. Debris flows always cause much more ruinous devastation in the developing regions rather than the developed regions due to the limited hazards research and mitigation level and/or financial support.





It is the responsibility of scientists to investigate the hazards mechanism and improve the mitigation technology.





Chemical elements in Ascomycetes and Basidiomycetes

The reference mushrooms as instruments for investigating bio-indication and biodiversity. Fungi in the wild are among the principal agents in biogeochemical cycles; those cycles of matter and energy which enable

ecosystems to work. By investigating the biodiversity of Italian fungal species and concentration levels of chemical elements in them, it may be possible to employ these fungi as biological indicators for the quality of forest, woodland and semi-natural environments. The data archives of this report record the dry-material concentrations, of 35 chemical elements, including heavy metals, in over 9000 samples of higher mushrooms. 

- Pang Daeng Sustainable Upland Farming Community Hilltribe farmers in Pang Daeng community have farmed permanent hill fields for three decades by relay cropping maize with various green manure cover crops. They also diversify production and income with dispersed plantings of fruit trees and indigenous agroforestry efforts.
- Mae Jo University Energy Research Center- The Mae Jo University Energy Research Center is a
 research and educational facility that offers a wide range of alternative energy approaches such as wind,
 solar and gasifier technology.
- Mae Jo University Vermiculture Facility Mae Jo has a large vermiculture facility in which food wastes
 from the university, and other sources, are converted by earthworms into commercial vermicompost that
 improves farm and garden soils.
- Chiang Mai Aquatic Development Farm The Chiang Mai Aquatic Development Farm is a tilapia hatchery that employs 36 people and produces approximately 2.5 million tilapia fry per month which are bought by fish farmers across northern Thailand and are grown out for the local markets.
- UHDP Agroforestry and Small Farm Resource Center The UHDP Center focuses on small-scale sustainable agriculture technologies being promoted among resource-poor hilltribe communities. Such approaches include agroforestry, natural backyard farming and appropriate technologies such as alternative cooking fuel and earthen houses. The ECHO Asia Seed Bank is also located at the UHDP Center.
- Natural Agriculture Co. Ltd Working in partnership with the Forest Industry Organization, a department of the Thai Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources, this company recycles and transforms natural wastes, such as teak residue, into reusable organic compost and organic fertilizer.
- Pang Soong and Raintree Foundation Hydro-Energy and Ecology Site Participants will visit the Raintree Foundation office, http://www.raintree-foundation.org/index.php/rain-tree-foundation.html, located at the McKean Rehabilitation Center for an introduction to the foundation's work related to children's education, water projects and other community-based development activities. Afterward the participants will travel to the Pang Soong Lodge, http://www.pang-soong-lodge.com/wordpress/, located at a 1000 meter elevation site 50 km east of Chiang Mai, to see a working ram pump designed and installed by the Raintree Foundation, as well as a micro-hydro electrical power plant that supplements Pang Soong's electrical needs. Visitors will also see Pang Soong's outdoor education lab that includes an evergreen forest and agro-ecological component.
