
# Editor's Note

#### Update on the Soil Thematic Strategy

The implementation of the Soil Thematic Strategy and ongoing activities COM(2012) 46.

Some five years after the adoption of the Soil Thematic Strategy, on 13 February 2012 the European Commission published a policy report on the implementation of the Strategy and ongoing activities (COM(2012) 46). The report provides an overview of the actions undertaken by the European Commission to implement the four pillars of the Strategy, namely awareness raising, research, integration, and legislation. It underlines that at the March 2010 Environ-



ment Council a minority of Member States blocked further progress on the proposed Soil Framework Directive and that the proposal remains on the Council's table.

#### The State of Soil in Europe

A contribution of the JRC to the European Environment Agency's Environment State and Outlook Report - SOER 2010. This Reference Report uses data from the European Soil Data Centre (ESDAC), managed on behalf of EU institutions by the JRC. The information also helps European citizens to better understand, care for and improve Europe's environment. The soil assessment was one of a set of 13 Europe-wide thematic assessments of key environmental themes.



#### Updated Global Carbon Map

The updated global carbon map improves upon the rather coarse data on soil carbon (IGBP-DIS 2000) that were used in UNEP-WCMC's Carbon and biodiversity: a demonstration atlas (Kapos et al. 2008). A global map of estimated soil carbon stocks to 1m depth was generated based on the soil organic carbon and bulk density values included in the HWSD (FAO/IIASA/ISRIC/ISS-CAS/JRC 2009).



#### Conference 'Soil remediation and soil sealing'

The Environment Directorate-General of the European Commission will host a high-level conference on 'Soil remediation and soil sealing' in Brussels (Belgium) on 10-11 May 2012. The conference objective is to highlight the importance of tackling soil contamination at an early stage and the opportunities that that offers to the European remediation industry. #### Global Soil Organic Carbon Estimates

Organic carbon density (t ha-1) datasets for the topsoil (0 – 30cm) and the subsoil layer (30 – 100cm) from the amended HWSD are made available to the public users. The Global Soil Organic Carbon estimates are available in 2 different grid resolutions (ZIP compression): a) Raster layer with resolution of 30 arc second (which corresponds to a grid size of approx. 1km x 1km at the Equator and b) Raster layer with



resolution of 5 arc minute (which corresponds to a grid size of approx. 9km x 9km at the Equator). The data are in Idrisi format. They are **freely available upon request**.

#### Global Soil Organic Carbon Estimates and the Harmonized World Soil Database

Global estimates of soil organic carbon stocks have been produced in the past to support the calculation of potential emissions of CO2 from the soil under scenarios of change land use/cover and climatic conditions (IPCC, 2006), but very few global estimates are presented as spatial data. For global spatial layers on soil parameters, the most recent and complete dataset is available as the Harmonized World Soil Database (HWSD). The amended HWSD was compared to data from 4 other global data sets on SOC stocks. The comparative



evaluation has demonstrated that bulk density is the most important factor for estimating SOC stocks and mainly responsible for the differences between estimates.


